STORM ALERT

SNOW SHOWERS... A COLD FRONT IS GOING TO BRING ANOTHER MINOR SNOW THREAT TO THE AREA TODAY. THE DIFFERENCE FROM TUESDAY'S EVENT IS THAT THIS ONE LOOKS LIKE ANY PRECIP THAT FALLS WILL BE IN THE FORM OF SNOW. HOWEVER, IT APPEARS IT IS GOING TO BE MORE OF THE HIT OR MISS VARIETY WITH SOME PLACES SEEING SPOTTY COATINGS FROM SNOW SHOWERS. TEMPS IN THE MID 30S TODAY ALSO MAKE IT A BIT UNCERTAIN IF PAVEMENTS WILL ACCUMULATE. THE ACCUMULATION THREAT BELOW IS SMALL BUT MAY CAUSE SOME SLIPPERY SURFACES FOR THE EVENING COMMUTE.
